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# ECONOMIC AND FINANCIAL REVIEW

July - December, 1985

The economy recorded significant progress during the year 1985 reflecting the continued buoyancy of the Export Processing Zone (EPZ) and the recovery in sugar production. GDP in real terms increased by 6.5 per cent in 1985 as compared with an increase of 4.2 per cent in 1984. There was a deceleration in the rate of inflation and the employment situation showed a distinct improvement.

The financial strategy worked out under the stand-by arrangement with the IMF was pursued in 1985. The restrictive stance of monetary and credit policy has been maintained with the aim of protecting the foreign exchange reserves of the country and maintaining conditions conducive to sustained growth.

The economic and financial developments during the period July-December, 1985, are outlined in some detail in the following sections:

#### I. Production, Prices, Wages and Employment

(a) National Income: Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at factor cost increased in nominal terms by 11.6 per cent from Rs 11,985 million in 1984 to Rs 13,375 million in 1985. In real terms, it went up by 5.5 per cent compared to 4.2 per cent in 1984. Gross National Product (GNP) at factor cost rose from Rs 11,372 million in 1984 to Rs 12,625 million in 1985 representing an increase of 11 per cent against 12.3 per cent in the preceding year. Per Capita GNP at factor cost attained Rs 12,816 in 1985 rising by 10 per cent from Rs 11,638 in the previous year.

Gross Domestic Fixed Capital Formation (GDFCF) at current prices rose by 13.7 per cent from Rs 2,500 million in 1984 to Rs 2,910 million in 1985. In real terms, the increase was of the order of 6.9 per cent as against 4.8 per cent in 1984. Aggregate consumption expenditure as a proportion of GDP at market prices registered a decline from 81.9 per cent in 1984 to 80.5 in 1985.

(b) Sugar: As a result of the more favourable weather conditions which prevailed, sugar production recovered by 12.2 per cent to 645,797\* tons in 1985 as compared to 575,617 tons in 1984. The recovery was attributable to an increase of 11.47 per cent in cane production from 5,008,774 tons in 1984 to 5,583,345 tons in 1985 and to the extraction rate which at 11.57 per cent proved to be the highest since 1974. During the period July-December, 1985, sugar exports at 310,400 tons were somewhat lower as compared to 320,276 tons exported during the corresponding period of 1984. However, in value terms, sugar exports during the second half of 1985 were higher at Rs 1,705.8 million as compared to Rs 1,582.2 million during the corresponding period of 1984.

Sugar prices on the London Terminal Market picked up considerably during the second half of 1985. The monthly average price of raw sugar per ton went up by nearly 50 per cent from US\$ 92.96 in July to US\$ 138.84 in December. The average price for the second half of 1985 works out to US\$ 126.39 as compared to US\$ 115.79 for the corresponding period of 1984.

(c) Tea: Production of green leaf during the period under review amounted to 16.56 thousand tons as against 18.67 thousand tons in the corresponding period of 1984. Production of black tea registered a decline of nearly 18.0 per cent from 3.64 thousand tons during the second half of 1984 to 2.99 thousand tons for the same period of 1985. With the steep decline in tea prices on the London market in the second half of 1985, exports of tea during that period fetched only Rs 46.9 million for an export volume of 2.84 thousand tons in comparison with Rs 104.0 million for a lower volume of 2.6 thousand metric tons during the corresponding period of 1984. The price of tea obtainable abroad slumped drastically from Rs 38.70 a kilo in the first quarter to Rs 16.34 a kilo in the last quarter of 1985.

(d) **Industry**: During the second half of 1985, 38 new entreprises came into operation in the EPZ generating additional employment of 6,600 workers. At the end of December 1985, there were 227 EPZ enterprises with an aggregate employment level of 53,500 as against 195 EPZ industries with a total work force of 37,532 at the end of December, 1984.

EPZ exports witnessed a substantial increase in the second half of 1985 of Rs 1,950 million as compared with Rs 1,243 million in the second half of 1984. During the whole year 1985, EPZ exports reached Rs 3,283 million, representing an increase of 52.6 per cent as compared to Rs 2,150.7 million in 1984. EPZ imports went up from Rs 871 million in the second half of 1984 to Rs 1,350 million in the second half of 1985.

At the end of December 1985, 187 enterprises were operating with Development Certificates with a total employment of 9,830 workers as compared with 174 units employing 9,363 workers in December, 1984.

- (e) **Prices:** The Consumer Price Index (CPI) (Base January June 1982 = 100) rose by 2.4 points from 121.2 in June 1985 to 123.6 in December, 1985, as compared with an increase of 5.0 points during the corresponding period of 1984. The rise in the prices of edible oil (+0.4), fresh fish (+0.3), medicinal products (+0.3), eggs (+0.2), powdered milk (+0.2) and other miscellaneous goods and services (+1.9) was partly offset by a fall in the prices of fresh vegetables (-0.7), fresh fruits (-0.1) and butter (-0.1). The rate of inflation in 1985 declined to 6.7 per cent compared with 7.3 per cent in 1984.
- (f) Wages: A wage increase of 9.0 per cent was awarded, as from July 1985, to both public and private sector employees earning up to Rs 1,100 per month and a flat increase of Rs 100 to employees earning more, in order to compensate for the rise in the cost of living during 1984-85. The average wage compensation awarded for 1985-86 is estimated at 5.0 per cent as compared with 3.0 per cent in 1984-85.
- (g) Employment: Between September, 1984, and September, 1985, the total number of persons employed in large-scale establishments increased by 14,401 to 215,028. The new job openings were in Manufacturing (+13,978), Construction (+712), Trade (+327), Financing and Business Services (+252) and Transport (+48). However, employment in other sectors, namely Agriculture and Fishing, Development Works Corporation, Electricity and Water, and Community Services, declined by 916.

At the end of December, 1985, the total number of registered unemployed was estimated at 58,453. The unemployment rate was reckoned at 15.8 per cent as compared with 18.3 per cent at the end of December, 1984.

#### II. Monetary Developments

(a) Monetary Aggregates: Aggregate monetary resources (AMR) stood at Rs 7,403.0 million at the end of December, 1985, and consisted of quasi-money (time and savings deposits) amounting to Rs 5,028.7 million and money supply (currency and demand deposits) of Rs 2,374.4 million. AMR increased by Rs 852.0 million or by 13.0 per cent during the second half of 1985 as compared to 11.5 per cent in the second half of 1984.

Money supply  $(M_1)$  grew by Rs 353.8 million or 17.5 per cent between June and December, 1985, as compared to a growth rate of 18.9 per cent witnessed during the corresponding period of 1984. Of the two components of  $M_1$ , currency in circulation expanded at a faster rate (+22.6 per cent) than demand deposits (+13.5 per cent).

Quasi-money increased by Rs 498.2 million or 11.0 per cent from Rs 4,530.5 million in June to Rs 5,028.7 million in December, 1985. The rate of growth of quasi-money was lower at 8.1 per cent in the corresponding period of 1984. Time deposits contributed a higher amount of Rs 301.8 million to the growth of quasi-money in the second half of 1985 and savings deposits for a lesser amount of Rs 196.4 million.

Monetary expansion during the second half of 1985 was largely due to the growth in domestic credit which expanded by Rs 901.8 million as compared to an increase of Rs 441.5 million in the second half of 1984. Net bank credit to the public sector rose from Rs 4,416.8 million in June to Rs 5,095.6 million in December, 1985, or by 15.4 per cent as Government relied largely on domestic resources for financing the budget deficit. During the same period, bank credit to the private sector increased by Rs 223.0 million or by 6.1 per cent to Rs 3,900.3 million by end-December. As a result, 75.3 per cent of domestic credit expansion during this period was channelled to the public sector and 24.7 per cent to the private sector. Net foreign assets of the banking system showed only a slight variation over the period rising by Rs 8.5 million from Rs 765.9 million to Rs 774.4 million.

(b) Sectoral Distribution of Private Sector Credit: Commercial banks credit to the private sector witnessed an overall increase of 6.1 per cent from Rs 3,677.3 million in June to Rs 3,900.3 million in December, 1985, as compared with 8.1 per cent in the second half of 1984. Bank credit to the priority and semi-priority sectors rose by Rs 180.3 million out of the total increase of Rs 223.0 million and represented 75.3 per cent of the credit outstanding at the end of December, 1985, as compared with 73.9 per cent at the end of December, 1984.

Credit to the industrial sector (EPZ, DC, Ex-DC and, Other Industries and Manufacturers) accounted for 56.2 per cent or Rs 125.3 million of the overall increase in private sector credit. EPZ companies absorbed Rs 32.9 million while DC and Ex-DC industries accounted for Rs 45.6 million. With sugar export proceeds usually flowing in during this period, credit demand by the sugar sector remained subdued and the increase in credit registered by this sector in the second half of 1985 amounted to Rs 31.5 million. Within the non-priority sectors, bank credit went up by Rs 44.8 million and Rs 20.5 million to 'Traders' and 'Other Customers', respectively, and declined with respect to other activities.

(c) Central Bank Credit to Commercial Banks: Commercial banks resorted to central bank credit for a daily average amount of Rs 67.1 million in the second half of 1985 as against Rs 31.0 million in the corresponding period of the previous year. The overall liquidity position of banks was tighter in the earlier months of the period and their recourse to the central bank peaked at an average of Rs 120.8 million in August, 1985, but declined to a low of Rs 30.0 million in December. Borrowings from the central bank were made mostly under the export bills rediscounting facility with a daily average of Rs 40.0 million. The central bank also provided a daily average amount of Rs 10.9 million as advances at Bank Rate.

During the period under review, the Bank provided to the Mauritius Co-operative Central Bank a daily average amount of Rs 8.9 million under special lines of credit for onlending to small planters at concessional rates of interest.

(d) Interbank Money Market: During the second half of 1985, banks continued to have recourse to the inter-bank money market for meeting temporary liquidity shortages. The overall daily average amount of inter-bank transactions ranged from Rs 93.6 million in July to Rs 8.8 million in December, 1985. Activity on the inter-bank market was reduced towards the end of the period under review and was associated with a decline in the amounts traded on the term money market. Term money transactions dropped from a daily average of Rs 55.8 million in July to nil in December. The call money market remained active throughout the period with daily average transactions ranging between Rs 37.1 million in October and Rs 7.7 million in December. Transactions in money at short notice were less important.

The all-market weighted average interest rate varied from 11.2 per cent to 11.4 per cent, a range which was not significantly different from that observed in the first half of 1985. Rates were determined by transactions on the call market within a range of 10.75 per cent to 11.7 per cent. The decline in activity on the market did not materially affect interest rates.

#### III. Government Finance

(a) Budgetary Operations: Government budgetary operations during the first six months of financial year 1985-86 resulted in a deficit of Rs 372.8 million as compared with Rs 476.5 million during the corresponding period of financial year 1984-85. Total revenue and grants are estimated at Rs 1,773.8 million. Adjusted recurrent revenue increased by an estimated Rs 285.4 million to Rs 1,714.5 million. This rise was mainly caused by larger revenue collection from indirect taxes following the increase in June, 1985, in the rate of stamp duty on imports from 13.2 to 17.0 per cent. Total expenditure and net lending increased by Rs 229.6 million to Rs 2,146.6 million with a fall in capital expenditure offset by a rise in both recurrent expenditure and net lending. An estimated total amount of Rs 1,184.0 million, or about 63 per cent of adjusted recurrent expenditure was spent on wages, salaries and interest payments on external and internal debt.

The deficit was financed exclusively from local sources. Gross external loan disbursement amounted to Rs 96.9 million while amortization amounted to Rs 259.2 million. The domestic sector provided a total amount of Rs 535.1 million to cover the deficit and the net foreign debt repayment. The bulk of this amount was met by the central bank which provided an amount of Rs 494.0 million to the Government. Table III.1 shows the consolidated budgetary accounts.

(b) Internal Public Debt: During the first half of financial year 1985-86, total internal debt of the Government increased by Rs 628.1 million to Rs 6,045.4 million, compared with an increase of Rs 222.7 million during the corresponding period of 1984-85. There was no issue of Government stocks during the period under review; however, stocks for an amount of Rs 120.0 million were redeemed. Net issue of Treasury Bills amounted to Rs 751.0 million and the nominal value of Treasury Bills outstanding at the end of December, 1985, was Rs 3,488.7 million. Table III.2 shows the trends in the internal debt.

#### IV. EXTERNAL TRADE AND BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

(a) External Trade: In spite of the faster growth of exports relative to imports, there was a widening of the visible trade deficit during the year 1985. The visible trade deficit increased by 6.8 per cent, from Rs 1,315.2 million in 1984 to Rs 1,404.2 million in 1985. However, expressed in terms of SDRs, the trade deficit declined by 3.7 per cent, from SDRs 93.1 million to SDRs 89.7 million. Table IV.1 summarizes the trends in visible trade over the last five years.

Total exports increased by 28.2 per cent in value terms, from Rs 5,178.8 million in 1984 to Rs 6,636.8 million in 1985. The volume of exports grew by about 15.4 per cent and export prices registered an increase of the order of 11.1 per cent. In terms of SDRs, total exports went up by 15.6 per cent, from SDRs 366.6 million in 1984 to SDRs 423.9 million in 1985. The value of sugar exports increased to Rs 2,867 million in 1985, from Rs 2,522.6 million in 1984, reflecting partly the higher volume of sugar shipments, up by 8,778 tons to 539,502 tons.

The momentum in the EPZ sector was maintained in 1985 and the share of EPZ exports in total exports rose further to 49.5 per cent in that year from 41.5 per cent in 1984. EPZ exports went up by 52.6 per cent in value terms, from Rs 2,150.7 million in 1984 to Rs 3,283 million in 1985. Textile and clothing exports accounted for about 80 per cent of total EPZ exports in 1985. The price and volume increases for EPZ exports in 1985 are estimated at 17 per cent and 30.5 per cent, respectively. The value of tea exports dropped to Rs 178 million in 1985, from the high level of Rs 249.1 million in 1984. The decline in the value of tea exports in 1985 reflected mainly the depressed prices of tea on export markets, since the volume of tea exports was about the same as in the previous year. Exports of molasses rose from Rs 61.5 million in 1984 to Rs 71.3 million in 1985, the increase being essentially volume-related.

The nominal value of imports rose by 23.8 per cent, from Rs 6,494.0 million in 1984 to Rs 8,041 million in 1985. Imports, measured in foreign currency (SDR) terms, grew by about 11.7 per cent in 1985. Prices of imports are estimated to have increased by about 9.6 per cent in 1985 whereas the increase in the volume of imports was of 13.0 per cent. As in the preceding year, the most buoyant component of import demand was intermediate goods used for supporting industrial activity. An analysis of the structural changes in imports between 1984 and 1985 shows that the share of intermediate goods (SITC 2, 5 and 6) in total imports has increased by 2.6 percentage points to 44.1 per cent. The corresponding shares of Food, Beverages, Animal and Vegetable Oils and Fats (SITC 0, 1 and 4) and of Petroleum Products (SITC 3) in total imports declined further to 20.6 per cent and 14.9 per cent in 1985 from 23.8 per cent and 16.6 per cent in the preceding year. Table IV.2 shows a break-down of the broad categories of imports for the period 1981 to 1985.

(b) Balance of Payments: The overall balance of payments registered a significant surplus of 508 million in 1985 as compared with a deficit of Rs 253 million in 1984. The current account registered a lower deficit of Rs 490 million in 1985 as compared with Rs 716 million in 1984. The capital account came up with a higher surplus.

(c) Foreign Exchange Reserves: The level of foreign exchange reserves increased from Rs 852.0 million at the end of June, 1985 to Rs 882.0 million at the end of December, 1985 with a low of Rs 569.5 million in July, 1985. In December, 1984, the level of foreign exchange reserves was lower at Rs 592 million. During the period under review, purchases from the International Monetary Fund under the current stand-by arrangement amounted to SDR 14 million (Rs 218 million) and repurchases from the Fund amounted to SDR 21 million (Rs 331 million). During the year 1985, total purchases amounted to SDR 35.5 million (Rs 559 million) whereas total repurchases amounted to SDR 48 million (Rs 746 million).
