## ECONOMIC AND FINANCIAL REVIEW

(January - March, 1985)

The economic scene during the period January-March, 1985 was marked by a strengthening of recovery in industrial activities. The industrial sector, whose performance in terms of output, employment creation and as a potential earner of foreign exchange has been indeed encouraging, is deemed to be the main engine of economic growth. The response to the widespread campaign launched by Government to attract foreign investments to the Export Processing Zone (EPZ) has been positive; foreign investments during the first quarter of 1985 amounted to Rs 43.3 million as against Rs 58.2 million for the full year 1984.

In order to sustain the conditions for further investments in the country and to protect its foreign exchange reserves, the stance of restrictive monetary and credit policy introduced within the framework of the stabilization programme has been maintained. Mauritius entered into a fifth stand-by arrangement with the IMF in January, 1985 covering a period of 18 months for an amount of SDR 49 million.

The economic and financial developments during the period January-March, 1985 are outlined in some detail in the following sections:

#### I. Production and Prices

- (a) Sugar: In view of the favourable weather conditions which prevailed during the vegetative scason, sugar production for 1985 is projected at 665,000 tons, representing a 15.5 per cent increase over the 1984 production level of 575,617 tons. A volume of 153,625 tons of sugar valued at Rs 768.7 million were exported during the first three months of 1985 as against 143,358 tons valued at Rs 625.9 million during the corresponding period of 1984. Sugar prices on the London Terminal Market remained depressed during the period under review. The price per ton of raw sugar which was quoted at US \$98 at the beginning of the year increased to US\$122.5 on the 31st January, and dropped to US\$108.5 at the end of March, 1985. The average price per ton of sugar for January-March, 1985 works out to US \$ 106.5 which is markedly down as compared with the average price of US \$ 171.9 for the corresponding quarter of 1984.
- (b) Tea: Production of black tea during the period January-March, 1985 was higher at 3.1 thousand tons compared with 2.9 thousand tons produced during the corresponding period of 1984. However, exports of tea was lower at 2.0 thousand tons during the first quarter of 1985 compared with that of 2.6 thousand tons exported during the first quarter of 1984. Export earnings on account of tea, consequently decreased by 14 per cent from Rs 88.6 million in the first quarter of 1984 to Rs 76.3 million in the same quarter of 1985. Tea prices on the London tea market sank to a 19-month low of 139.62 pence a kilo compared to an all-time high of 317.44 pence a kilo in January, 1984.
- (c) Industry: During the quarter ended March, 1985, 18 new enterprises came into operation in the EPZ. These new enterprises generated 5,818 additional employment. At the end of March, 1985 there were 215 operating EPZ enterprises as against 153 in March,

1984. The number of workers in the EPZ thus rose by 13,818 from 28,954 at the end of March, 1984 to 42,772 at the end of March, 1985. The value added by the EPZ rose from Rs 530 million in 1983 to Rs 750 million in 1984 and its share in GDP at factor cost also rose from 4.8 per cent to 6.4 per cent.

EPZ exports registered an increase of 40.5 per cent from Rs 361.3 million during the first quarter of 1984 to Rs 507.6 million during the first quarter of 1985. This is the first time that EPZ exports have exceeded the Rs 500 million mark for a quarter. EPZ imports attained Rs 507 million during the first quarter of 1985. Net exports therefore decreased by Rs 0.6 million during the first quarter of 1985.

At the end of March, 1985 there were 174 enterprises operating with Development Certificates with an employment level of 9,440 as compared with 167 enterprises employing 8,936 workers in March, 1984.

(d) **Prices**: The Consumer Price Index (Base January-June = 100) rose from 118.2 in December, 1984 to 121.7 in March, 1985 or by 3.5 points compared with an increase of 4.9 points during the corresponding period of 1984. The inflation rate for 1984 was 7.3 per cent.

#### II. Monetary Developments

(a) Money Supply: Money supply (i.e. currency with public and demand deposits of the banking system) dropped significantly by Rs 232 million or 11.3 per cent in the first quarter of 1985 and amounted to Rs 1,818.8 million at the end of March. Unlike the situation in the corresponding quarter of 1984, the present large drop in money supply was caused mainly by a significant fall in the level of demand deposits besides a seasonal decline in currency with public. Demand deposits declined from Rs 1,092.6 million at the end of December, 1984 to Rs 931.6 million at the end of March, 1985 i.e. by Rs 161.0 million against Rs 1.7 million during only the same period of 1984. The seasonal drop in currency with public, however, was lower than that registered in the first quarter of 1984. Currency with public amounted to Rs 887.2 million in March, 1985 i.e. a drop of Rs 71 million from the December 1984 level of Rs 958.2 million while the drop in first quarter of 1984 was Rs 118.3 million.

As indicated in Table II.1, the contractionary effect of the large decline in net domestic credit on money supply more than offset the expansionary effect of the increase in net foreign assets. Net domestic credit declined by Rs 306.3 million from Rs 7,880.6 million at the end of December, 1984 to Rs 7,574.3 million at the end of March, 1985. Government and the private sector accounted for Rs 4,172.6 million and Rs 3,401.7 million respectively of the total amount of credit outstanding at the end of March, 1985. Public sector credit dropped by Rs 300.7 million between end December, 1984 and end March, 1985 accounting for nearly the entire decline in domestic credit during the period. Private sector credit declined by Rs 5.6 million during the period under review. The net foreign assets of the banking system increased by Rs 187.6 million from Rs 354.6 million at the end of December, 1984 to Rs 642.2 million at the end of March, 1985. Net foreign assets tend to rise in the first quarter of the calendar year because of continued inflow of sugar export proceeds while capital outflows are generally lower since large payments in respect of debt-servicing do not usually fall within this period.

Quasi-money (time and savings deposits) increased by Rs. 174.8 million or 4.2 per cent from Rs 4,145 million in December, 1984 to Rs 4,319.8 million in March, 1985. The expansion in the first quarter of 1984 was lower at Rs 91.6 million or 2.5 per cent. However, as in 1984, the expansion of quasi-money was influenced by rising levels of savings deposits only since time deposits actually declined. During the first quarter of 1985, savings deposits grew by Rs 177.2 million to Rs 2,160.8 million in March, 1985 while time deposits dropped marginally by Rs 2.4 million to Rs 2,159 million.

#### (b) Sectoral Distribution of Private Sector Credit

Private sector credit amounted to Rs 3,401.7 million at the end of March, 1985 showing a slight decline during the first quarter of 1985 of Rs 5.6 million against an expansion of Rs 96.7 million during the same quarter of last year. The sectoral distribution of private sector credit during the period January-March, 1985 was marked by meaningful developments as outlined below.

Credit to the EPZ sector expanded by Rs 86.4 million in the first quarter of 1985 partly reflecting the seasonality of Mauritian textiles production and partly reflecting accelerated development in this fast-growing sector. EPZ credit amounted to Rs 730 million at the end of March, 1985, absorbing 21.5 per cent of overall private sector credit against 18.1 per cent in March, 1984. On the other hand, credit to the non-EPZ industrial sectors (DC, Ex-DC and Other Industries & Manufacturers) declined by Rs 20 million for Rs 923.3 million in December, 1984 to Rs 903.3 million in March, 1985.

Credit to the sugar sector reached Rs 517.6 million in March, 1985 showing a drop during the quarter under review of Rs 39.3 million as compared with an expansion of Rs 22.5 million in the same quarter of 1984.

Credit to the remaining sectors declined by a total amount of Rs 5.4 million to Rs 883.6 million in March, 1985. In the corresponding quarter of 1984 an expansion of Rs 27 million was recorded. The drop in 1985 is partly reflective of the impact of the credit policy guidelines issued by the Bank of Mauritius for banks to give priority to productive sectors.

#### (c) Central Bank Credit to Commercial Banks

During the first quarter of 1985 the daily average amount of central bank credit utilized by commercial banks amounted to Rs 32.7 million as against Rs 11.1 million in the corresponding period of 1984. Banks did not avail themselves of normal advances but rather made use of only export refinance facilities by rediscounting export bills for a daily average amount of Rs 20.2 million during the quarter.

As in the past, the Bank continued to make available to the Mauritius Co-operative Central Bank special lines of credit for meeting the demands of small planters. A daily average of Rs 10.7 million was borrowed by the bank under this facility during January-March, 1985.

#### (d) Interbank Money Market

The daily average of interbank transactions during the first quarter of 1985 amounted to Rs 62.6 million as compared to an average of only Rs 13.5 million for the corresponding quarter of 1984. Higher level of interbank activity in 1985 was accompanied by a pronounced recourse by banks to term money transactions which accounted for 83.9 per cent of all deals. Taken as a whole, interbank transactions ranged, during the quarter under review between a trough level of Rs 33.5 million reached in February and a peak level of Rs 110.0 million in March. In the first quarter of 1984, the range settled down at a much lower level of Rs 3.5 million to Rs 32.8 million.

A tendency for interest rates on the interbank market to go up was observed during the last half of 1984. This tendency persisted in the first quarter of 1985. The all-market weighted average rate remained more or less at around 11.4 per cent during each of the three months under review. Because of the dominance of the market by term money transactions, the overall rate prevailing on the market was strongly influenced by the ruling rates for term money.

#### III. GOVERNMENT FINANCE

(a) **Budgetary Operations**: Adjusted recurrent revenue during the period beginning with July, 1984 to March, 1985 amounted to Rs 2,623.5 million of which direct taxes accounted for Rs 453.2 million or 17.3 per cent and indirect taxes Rs 1,937.5 million or 73.9 per cent. Adjusted capital revenue amounted to Rs 12.2 million. Adjusted recurrent expenditure and adjusted capital expenditure during the first three quarters ended March, 1985 totalled Rs 2,579.1 million and Rs 309.8 million respectively.

The overall budget deficit for the first nine months of the year 1984-85 amounted to Rs 281.7 million. It was financed by borrowings from abroad which included the fifth Euro-dollar loan of Rs 583.8 million. Net of loan repayments, foreign financing of the fiscal deficit for the period July 1984 to March 1985 amounted to Rs 382.3 million.

(b) **Public Debt:** Medium and long-term internal debt of Government rose by Rs 85.6 million from Rs 2,263.8 million at the end of December, 1984 to Rs 2,349.4 million at the end of March, 1985. During this period, Government stocks amounting to Rs 150.0 million were issued. With the inclusion of short-term debt obligations, namely Treasury Bills, total public internal debt shows a decrease of Rs 87.2 million from Rs 5,183.6 million at the end of December, 1984 to Rs 5,096.4 million at the end of March, 1985.

At the end of December, 1984, outstanding Government external debt excluding borrowings under the IMF stand-by arrangements, stood at Rs 5,452.4 million. For the country as a whole, total external debt amounted to Rs 8,797.7 million. Total debt servicing for the whole country during the first six months of fiscal year 1984-85, amounted to Rs 955.7 million or about 23 per cent of the total value of goods and services exported during that period.

#### IV. EXTERNAL TRADE AND BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

(a) External Trade: Development in external trade during the first quarter of 1985 point to a 5.7 per cent reduction in the visible trade deficit, from Rs 399.5 million in the first quarter of 1984 to Rs 376.8 million in the corresponding quarter of this year. Measured in foreign currency (SDR) terms, the contraction in the trade deficit was more pronounced; it declined by 19.5 per cent, from SDRs 29.8 million to SDRs 24 million. The improvement in the visible trade account, expressed in SDR terms, derived from the faster growth of exports relative to imports. Table IV.1 below shows the trends in visible trade over the first quarter for the period 1980 to 1985.

Total exports amounted in value terms to Rs 1,394.2 million in the first quarter of 1985; it was 26 per cent higher than the total exports of Rs 1,106.8 million in the corresponding quarter of 1984. Export prices during the period January-March 1985, viewed against the level of the corresponding quarter of 1984, rose by 16.9 per cent thereby implying a growth rate of 7.8 per cent in the volume of exports. Sugar exports went up from Rs 625.9 million to Rs 768.7 million, reflecting partly the higher volume of sugar shipments during the first quarter of 1985, up by 10,362 tons to 153,625 tons. EPZ exports, buoyed up mainly by exports of Garments, rose by 40.5 per cent in value terms to Rs 507.6 million and accounted for 36.4 per cent of total exports during the period under review. The exports of EPZ products during the first quarter of 1984 amounted to Rs 361.3 million. The value of tea exports dropped from Rs 88.6 million to Rs 76.3 million, mainly on account of a reduction in the volume of tea exported.

Total imports, in nominal terms, rose by 17.6 per cent, from Rs 1,506.3 million in the first quarter of 1984 to Rs 1,771 million in the first quarter of 1985. Import prices recorded an increase of 12.9 per cent while the volume of imports grew by 4.2 per cent. An analysis of the changes in total imports between the first quarter of 1984 and of 1985 suggests that increased in imported of petroleum products (+ Rs 91.8 million) and of raw materials for the Export Processing Zone (+ Rs 93.9 million) accounted for about 70 per cent of the total increase in imports between these two periods.

(b) Balance of Payments: The current account deficit increased from Rs 237 million in 1983 to Rs 622 million in 1984. However, the overall balance of payments deficit declined from Rs 513 million in 1983 to Rs 253 million in 1984 due to a marked improvement in net capital movements.

#### (c) Foreign Exchange Reserves

As shown in Table IV.2 below, the level of foreign exchange reserves increased from Rs 569.5 million at the end of December, 1984, to Rs 649.2 million at the end of March, 1985.

During the quarter under review, transactions with the IMF consisted of purchases for a total amount of SDR 14.5 million (Rs 229 million) and repurchases for a total amount of SDR 11.4 million (Rs 220 million). The purchases consisted of a drawing in March, 1985, of SDR 7.0 million (Rs 110 million) under the new stand-by arrangement agreed with the IMF at the beginning of the year and another drawing of SDR 7.5 million (Rs 118 million) under the Compensatory Financing Facility in respect of a shortfall in exports. The repurchases consisted of an amount of (a) SDR 3.6 million (Rs 57 million) under the Buffer Stock Financing Facility, which had to be repaid in advance of schedule after the release of sugar stocked previously under the International Sugar Agreement following the non-renewal of the agreement at the end of 1984 and (b) a total amount of SDR 11 million (Rs 163 million) under previous purchases.
