# ECONOMIC AND FINANCIAL REVIEW

(July - December, 1988)

The upswing in economic activities since 1983 culminated in rapid economic growth which attained 8.9 per cent in 1986 and 8.4 per cent in 1987 which, however, slowed down to 5.7 per cent in 1988 as the economy, being still buoyant, is nearing full capacity utilization.

The projected growth for the year 1989 would be around 4.5 per cent. The continuing buoyancy of the economy has brought in its trail consumer price increases leading to an inflation rate of 9.2 per cent in 1988 and of about 16 per cent in 1988-89. Fine tuning of monetary and fiscal policies is, therefore, essential in restoring price stability and thus fostering non-inflationary growth.

## I. PRODUCTION AND PRICES

## (a) National Income

Gross Domestic Product (GDP) at factor cost increased by 15.4 per cent in nominal terms from Rs 19,625 million in 1987 to Rs 22,643 million in 1988 as compared to an increase of 19.3 per cent in the previous year. In real terms, GDP grew at 5.7 per cent in 1988 as against 8.4 per cent in 1987. Gross National Product (GNP) at factor cost recorded an increase of 15.6 per cent from Rs 19,087 million in 1987 to Rs 22,063 million in 1988 as compared to an increase of 21.4 per cent in the preceding year.

Gross Domestic Fixed Capital Formation (GDFCF) at current prices rose from Rs 5,090 million in 1987 to Rs 7,620 million in 1988 or by 49.7 per cent as compared to an increase of 30.8 per cent in the preceding year. In real terms, GDFCF grew at a higher rate of 30.6 per cent in 1988 as against 24.8 per cent in 1987. Aggregate consumption expenditure rose by a slightly lower rate of 20.4 per cent from Rs 17,085 million in 1987 to Rs 20,570 million in 1988 as compared to an increase of 21.4 per cent in the preceding year. However, as a percentage of GDP at market prices aggregate consumption expenditure increased from 72.5 per cent in 1987 to 75.1 per cent in 1988. Gross Domestic Savings increased at a reduced rate of 5.5 per cent from Rs 6,468 million in 1987 to Rs 6,823 million in 1988 as against an increase of 15.0 per cent in the preceding year. However, as percentage of GDP, it declined from 27.5 per cent to 24.9 per cent over the same period.

## (b) Sugar

Production of sugar cane declined from 6,230,700 tons in 1987 to 5,517,045 tons in 1988 due to unfavourable weather conditions during the growing season and a reduction of 661 hectares in the area under cultivation. Though the extraction rate of sugar rose from 11.09 per cent in 1987 to 11.50 in 1988 owing to favourable

weather conditions during the maturation season, sugar production went down by 8.2 per cent from 691,134 tons in 1987 to 634,224 tons in 1988. Sugar yield per hectare registered a marginal decrease from 8.93 tons in 1987 to 8.25 tons in 1988.

Between July and December, 1988, sugar exports amounted to 362,000 tons as against 334,000 tons exported in the corresponding period of 1987. Sugar export earnings during the second half of 1988 amounted to Rs 2,579 million as compared to Rs 2,388 million in the second half of 1987.

## (c)Industry

The number of enterprises operating in the Export Processing Zone increased from 579 in June, 1988 to 591 in December, 1988. However, employment in these enterprises declined by 2,537 from 91,617 in June, 1988 to 89,080 in December, 1988.

EPZ exports during the second half of 1988 amounted to Rs 4,560 million compared to Rs 3,752 million in the corresponding period of 1987. Over the same period, EPZ imports went up from Rs 2,629 million to Rs 2,964 million. For the whole year 1988, EPZ exports increased by 24.5 per cent from Rs 6,567 million in 1987 to Rs 8,176 million in 1988 whilst its imports increased by 22.7 per cent from Rs 4,801 million to Rs 5,890 million.

Net EPZ export earnings improved from Rs 1,766 million to Rs 2,286 million in 1988, that is, from 26.9 per cent to 28 per cent of its gross earnings.

Foreign investment in the EPZ sector rose by 18.3 per cent from Rs 183 million in 1987 to Rs 216 million in 1988

## (d) Prices

The downward trend in inflation rate was reversed in 1988. The rate of inflation attained 9.2 per cent in 1988 after having remarkably slowed down to 1.8 per cent in 1986 and 0.6 per cent in 1987. This renewed acceleration of inflation rate was due mainly to increases in the prices of such consumer items as rice, flour, bread and oil as a result of higher prices of these goods on the world market and of the appreciation of the US dollar, higher rates of excise duties on alcoholic beverages and tobacco, increases in tariffs for water charges and bus fares and unfavourable climatic conditions which caused prices of fresh vegetables, fruits and fish to go up.

## II.MONETARY AND CREDIT DEVELOPMENTS

During the period July to December 1988, the pace of monetary expansion showed some signs of deceleration due partly to the declining rate of growth of the net foreign assets of the banking system, the main source of monetary expansion, and partly to the mopping up of excess liquidity by the Bank of Mauritius in December 1988.

Net foreign assets of the banking system continued to go up reflecting the continuing overall balance of payments surplus; it increased by 16.6 per cent or by

Rs 1,036 million from Rs 6,255 million at the end of June 1988 to Rs 7,291 million at the end of December 1988 as compared to an increase of 37.7 per cent or Rs 1,404 million from Rs 3,729 million at the end of June 1987 to Rs 5,133 million at the end of December 1987.

Aggregate Monetary Resources (AMR) of the banking system increased by 12.8 per cent or by Rs 1,938 million from Rs 15,153 million at the end of June 1988 to Rs 17,091 million at the end of December 1988 as compared to an increase of 15.2 per cent in the corresponding period of 1987.

Money Supply (M1, i.e. currency with public and demand deposits), rose by 20.3 per cent or by Rs 628 million from Rs 3,087 million at the end of June 1988 to Rs 3,715 million at the end of December 1988, as compared to an increase of 28.9 per cent in the corresponding period of 1987. Currency with the public accounted for 54.1 per cent of money supply at the end of December 1988 as compared with a lower ratio of 51.3 per cent at the end of December 1987 whereas demand deposits accounted for 45.9 per cent at the end of December 1988 as compared with 48.7 per cent at the end of December 1987.

Quasi-money increased by 10.8 per cent or by Rs 1,309 million from Rs 12,067 million at the end of June 1988 to Rs 13,376 million at the end of December 1988 as compared to an increase of 11.5 per cent in the corresponding period of 1987. Savings deposits rose by Rs 639 million in the second half of 1988 to reach Rs 5,223 million while time deposits increased by Rs 670 million during the same period to Rs 8,152 million at the end of December 1988.

Domestic credit increased by 9.5 per cent, rising from Rs 11,758 million at the end of June 1988 to Rs 12,870 million at the end of December. as compared to an increase of 5.2 per cent in the second half of 1987. Bank Credit to the private sector rose by Rs 656 million from Rs 8,284 million at the end of June 1988 to Rs 8,940 million at the end of December 1988. Over the same period, net credit to Government by the banking system increased by Rs 456 million from Rs 3,474 million to Rs 3,930 million at the end of December 1988.

## (b) Sectoral Distribution of Commercial Bank's Credit to the Private Sector

Bank credit to the private sector increased by Rs 656 million from Rs 8,284 million at the end of June 1988 to Rs 8,940 million at the end of December 1988. The manufacturing sector (EPZ, DC, Small Scale Enterprises, Ex-Dc Industries and Other Industries and Manufacturers) accounted for Rs 556 million of the increase. Credit to sugar and other agriculture registered a decline of Rs 310 million during the period under review. However, credit to "Traders" and "Personal and Professional" sectors increased by Rs 199 million and Rs 60 million, respectively, during the second half of 1988.

Bank credit to EPZ increased by Rs 253 million from Rs 2,184 million in June 1988 to Rs 2,437 million in December 1988. Its share in total private sector credit outstanding at the end of December 1988 was 27.3 per cent as compared to 26.4 per cent in June 1988.

Over the same period credit to "Traders" also went up by Rs 199 million from Rs 737 million to Rs 936 million and its share in total private sector credit rose from 8.9 per cent to 10.5 per cent. The "Personal and Professional" sector registered a relatively smaller increase in credit of Rs 60 million from Rs 696 million to Rs 756 million with its share in total private sector remaining the same at 8.4 per cent.

# (c) Central Bank Credit to Commercial Banks

During the period July to December 1988 commercial banks borrowed funds from the Central Bank mainly under the two special schemes of the Advance Payments Scheme for Non-miller Planters and the Small Development Financing Scheme. Their borrowings at Bank Rate and by rediscounting export bills were relatively small. The overall daily average amount borrowed by the banks was higher at Rs 95 million in the second half of 1988 as compared with a daily average amount of Rs 40 million in the second half of 1987. Total borrowings peaked in July 1988 at Rs 224 million and then dropped to the trough level of Rs 80 million in August 1988.

## (d) Interbank Money Market

The interbank money market became less active during the second half of 1988 than in the first half of the year as a result of the improvement in the banks' overall liquidity situation. Total transactions on the market declined to a daily average of Rs 31 million during the second half of 1988 as compared with a daily average of Rs 88 million during the first half of the year. Interbank transactions on the Call Money market averaged Rs 22 million during July-December 1988 while transactions of Short Notice averaged Rs 9 million over the same period. This concentration at the short end of the market reflects essentially the temporary nature of the financial needs of banks over this period.

The all-market weighted average rate of interest edged up from 10.6 per cent

in June 1988 to 10.9 per cent in July and further to 11 per cent in November and December. The increase in the interbank rate reflected a discretionary gradual increase in banks' lending rates rather than a tightening up of the liquidity situation on the market.

## EXTERNAL TRADE AND BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

The overall balance of payments continued to show a surplus which increased from Rs 258 million in 1985 to Rs 1,716 million in 1986 and further to Rs 2,788 million in 1987 before declining to Rs 2,466 million in 1988.

#### **Current Account**

The current account of the balance of payments recorded a deficit estimated at Rs 560 million in 1988 compared with a surplus of Rs 815 million in 1987. The deficit was attributable to the purchase of two aircrafts by Air Mauritius in April 1988. Excluding the amount representing the purchase of these two aircrafts, the current account showed a surplus estimated at Rs 1,063 million in 1988.

Total exports increased from Rs 11,493 million in 1987 to Rs 13,490 million in 1988 or by 17.4 per cent as against an increase of 26.9 per cent in the previous year. Over the same period, total imports (excluding the purchase of the two aircrafts) rose from Rs 13,042 million to Rs 15,472 million showing an increase of 18.6 per cent as compared to an increase of 40.5 per cent in the previous year.

In spite of the negative impact of higher freight and insurance charges, interest payments and dividend outflows, the services account showed a surplus, though at a lower level, on account of increased earnings from investment income, Tourism and "Other Transportation". For 1988, the surplus on the services account was Rs 89 million, as against Rs 173 million in 1987. Reflecting the substantial increase in total imports, payments of freight and insurance charges increased from Rs 1,412 million in 1987 to Rs 1,707 million in 1988. Net earnings on passenger and port services rose from Rs 821 million in 1987 to Rs 846 million in 1988. Gross earnings from Tourism went up by 33.3 per cent, from Rs 1,786 million in 1987 to Rs 2,381 million in 1988. The increase in tourist receipts reflected a 15.6 per cent increase in the number of tourist arrivals from 207,570 in 1987 to 240,000 in 1988, and a 15.3 per cent increase in the average expenditure per tourist. Expenditure on foreign travel by residents also increased from Rs 661 million in 1987 to Rs 857 million in 1988. Net travel inflows amounted to Rs 1,524 million in 1988 as against Rs 1,125 million in 1987. The deficit on investment income, increased from Rs 533 million in 1987 to Rs 578 million in 1988 mainly on account of higher interest charges and dividend remittances abroad. The transfers account, boosted mostly by private remittances, made a significant contribution to the current account and overall balance of payments positions. The surplus on the transfers account increased from Rs 850 million in 1987 to Rs 1,237 million in 1988.

# Capital Account

The capital account showed a surplus of Rs 1,456 million in 1988 compared to Rs 733 million in 1987. This increase is due to a net capital inflow of Rs 1,342 million arising out of borrowings by Air Mauritius for the purchase of the two aircrafts. Direct foreign inward investment, too, continued its upward trend rising from Rs 221 million in 1987 to Rs 317 million in 1988. However, loan transactions by the Government during 1988 showed a net outflow of Rs 356 million on account of a sharp rise, from Rs 441 million in 1987 to Rs 1,211 million in 1988, in repayments mainly of Euro-dollar loans, a major part of which was effected ahead of maturity date.

# Foreign Exchange Reserves

The foreign exchange reserves of the Bank of Mauritius went up from Rs 1,830 million in December 1986 to Rs 4,225 million in December, 1987 and further to Rs 6,174 million in December, 1988 thus reflecting the continuing improvement though at a reduced rate, in the overall balance of payments position of the country. The level of foreign exchange reserves at the end of June 1988 provided an import coverage of about 18 weeks against 15 weeks at the end of December 1987.
