Monetary Aggregates

Monetary developments in the second half of calendar year 1992 were marked by a drop in net foreign assets of the banking system, the diminishing share of the public sector in net domestic credit, a large expansion in bank credit to the private sector and a deceleration in the growth rate of both money supply (M1) and aggregate monetary resources (M2).

Net foreign assets of the banking system shrunk by Rs 341.2 million from Rs 16,556.7 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 16,215.5 million at the end of December 1992, representing a drop of 2.1 per cent, as compared with an expansion of 12.7 per cent in the corresponding period of 1991.

Although in absolute terms, net domestic credit rose by Rs 3,087.2 million from Rs 23,075.5 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 26,162.7 million at the end of December 1992, its growth rate however slowed down to 13.4 per cent from 14.8 per cent in the corresponding period of 1991. The increase was almost solely due to a significant rise in bank credit to the private sector, which jumped by Rs 2,577.7 million, from Rs 16,107.5 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 18,685.2 million at the end of December, 1992, representing a higher increase of 16.0 per cent than that of 8.6 per cent recorded in the corresponding period of the preceding year. By contrast, credit to Government grew by Rs 509.5 million only, from Rs 6,968.0 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 7,477.5 million at the end of December 1992, or by 7.3 per cent as compared to 32.3 per cent in the corresponding period of the preceding year.

The contractionary effect of the drop in net foreign assets was completely offset by the expansionary effect of the increase in net domestic credit with the result that both money supply (M1) and aggregate monetary resources (M2) went up during the period under review, albeit at a slower rate, than in the corresponding period of 1991.

Aggregate monetary resources (M2) increased by Rs 2,597.0 million or by 8.1 per cent from Rs 32,105.0 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 34,702.0 million at the end of December 1992 as compared to an increase of 11.9 per cent registered in the corresponding period of the preceding year.

Money Supply (M1) increased from Rs 6,590.9 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 7,506.5 million at the end of December 1992 i.e an expansion of Rs 915.6 million or of 13.9 per cent as compared with an increase of Rs 1,232.7 million or of 22.6 per cent in the corresponding period of 1991.

Quasi-Money (savings deposits plus time deposits with commercial banks) grew by Rs 1,681.4 million from Rs 25,514.1 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 27,195.5 million at the end of December, 1992, representing an expansion of 6.6 per cent which is lower than the 9.2 per cent increase registered in the corresponding period of 1991. Savings deposits went up by Rs 1,271.9 million, from Rs 11,643.0 million to Rs 12,914.9 million, and accounted for 75 per cent of the increase in Quasi-Money. By contrast, time deposits grew by Rs 409.5 million only, from Rs 13,821.1 million to Rs 14,230.6 million.

The changes in monetary aggregates between June and December for the years 1990 through 1992 are shown in Table I.

Sectoral Distribution of Commercial Banks' Credit to the Private Sector

Effective 1st July 1992, the credit policy of the Bank of Mauritius underwent an important change. The ceiling on bank credit to priority sectors was abolished. (Priority sectors were re-defined to include the first fourteen sectors shown in Table II). A ceiling is however imposed on credit to non-priority sectors.

Bank credit to the private sector increased by Rs 2,577.7 million, from Rs 16,107.5 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 18,685.2 million at the end of December 1992, representing an expansion of 16.0 per cent, well above the increase of 8.6 per cent registered in the corresponding period of 1991. Around 20 per cent of this increase in private sector credit was accounted for by short-term advances to the Mauritius Sugar Syndicate, which is likely to thin out by the end of June 1993.

Credit to priority sectors grew by 18.7 per cent, from Rs 9,238.5 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 10,969.2 million at the end of December 1992 and credit to non priority sectors expanded by 12.6 per cent, from Rs 6,674.7 million to Rs 7,514.9 million.

Credit to the manufacturing sector (EPZ, DC, Ex-DC, Other Industries and Manufacturers and Pioneer Status) grew by 14.5 per cent or by Rs 948.8 million, from Rs 6,538.0 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 7,486.8 million at the end of December 1992. Credit to the 'EPZ' alone expanded by Rs 352.5 million, from Rs 3,393.7 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 3,746.2 million at the e d of December 1992, representing a higher growth rate of 10.4 per cent as compared with the 9.3 per cent registered in the corresponding period of 1991. Credit to 'DC Industries' went up by Rs 181.6 million, from Rs 719.0 million to Rs 900.6 million and to 'Other Industries and Manufacturers' by Rs 427.2 million, from Rs 1,906.3 million to Rs 2,333.5 million. As a percentage of total private sector credit, the share of manufacturing sector remained more or less unchanged at 40.1 per cent over the period under review.

In sharp contrast to the drop of 16.5 per cent in the corresponding period of 1991, credit to the sugar sector (Sugar Industry and MSS) increased by 4.1 per cent, from Rs 1,084.6 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 1,129.4 million at the end of December 1992. As a percentage of total credit, the share of the sugar sector however declined from 6.7 per cent in June 1992 to 6.0 per cent in December 1992.

Credit to 'Traders' went up by Rs 372.8 million, from Rs 1,823.7 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 2,196.5 million at the end of December 1992, or by a much higher rate of 20.4 per cent than that of 2.8 per cent registered in the corresponding period of 1991.

Table II shows the sector-wise distribution of private sector credit for the period June to December 1992.

Central Bank Credit to Commercial Banks

The level of central bank credit to commercial banks increased from Rs 47.0 million at the end of June 1992 to Rs 267.5 million at the end of December, 1992. The daily average amount of credit to banks during the period July-December 1992 stood at Rs 82.8 million, lower than that of Rs 106.2 million in the corresponding period of 1991. However, central bank credit to banks was more pronounced in the last quarter of the year 1992 with daily average amount of Rs 109.9 million, as compared with Rs 55.8 million in the preceding quarter. The daily average amount of export bills other than for sugar rediscounted by the Bank of Mauritius was Rs 36.6 million. The amount of such bills rediscounted reached a peak level of Rs 294.9 million during the period under review. Commercial banks also availed themselves of a daily average amount of Rs 46.2 million under the 'Small Development Financing Scheme'.

Interbank Money Market

During the period July-December 1992, total interbank transactions reached a daily average of Rs 75.9 million, up from Rs 51.3 million registered in the corresponding period of 1991. Most activity was concentrated on the call Money Market where daily transactions averaged Rs 74.1 million. Short Notice and Term Money transactions amounted to a daily average of Rs 1.1 million and Rs 0.7 million, respectively. The level of interbank transactions reached a peak of Rs 257.0 million in July 1992.

Interest rates on interbank transactions during the period under review ranged between 7.00 and 8.50 per cent per annum. The weighted average rate of interest for all types of interbank transactions dropped to 7.39 per cent per annum, down from 11.7 per cent per annum in the corresponding period of 1991.

Auctioning of Bills

During the period July-December 1992,34 auctions of 91-Day, 182-Day and 364-Day Bills were held on a weekly or twice weekly basis. The annual weighted yield rate of the accepted bids fluctuated between 5.98 and 6.56 per cent for 91-Day Bills, between 6.82 and 7.32 per cent for 182-Day Bills and between 6.94 and 7.98 per cent for 364-Day Bills. The overall weighted average yield rate for the three instruments was 7.05 per cent for the period under review.

Table III gives a detailed breakdown of the weighted yield rates for the three types of bills during the period under review.

Prices

As from July 1992, a new index with base July 1991-June 1992 = 100 was introduced to replace the old index with base July 1986-June 1987 = 100. Between June and December 1992, the Consumer Price Index with the new base rose by 4.2 points, from 103.4 in June 1992 to 107.6 in December 1992 as against a rise of 1.2 points in the corresponding period of 1991. The rate of inflation for calendar year was 4.6 per cent as compared with 7.0 per cent in the preceding year.

Foreign Exchange Reserves

The level of foreign exchange reserves of the Bank of Mauritius stood at Rs 13,886.7 million at the end of December 1992, representing a decline of Rs 845.7 million as compared with Rs 14,712.4 million as at the end of June 1992. However, on a calendar year basis, the level of foreign exchange reserves of the Bank rose by Rs 627.2 million, from Rs 13,259.5 million at the end of December 1991. The level of foreign exchange reserves of the Bank of Mauritius at the end of December 1992 represented 28 weeks of imports.
