ECONOMIC REVIEW

(JANUARY — MARCH, 1993)

Monetary Aggregates

Monetary developments during the first quarter of the year were characterized by an increase in the net foreign assets of the banking system and a drop in both bank credit to Government and money supply (M1).

Net foreign assets of the banking system went up by Rs 745.7 million from Rs 16,215.8 million at the end of December 1992 to Rs 16,961.5 million at the end of March 1993, showing an increase of 4.6 per cent, lower than that of 5.1 per cent registered in the corresponding period of 1992.

Net domestic credit went up by Rs 151.1 million, from Rs 26,162.4 million at the end of December 1992 to Rs 26,313.5 million at the end of March 1993, or by 0.6 per cent as compared with a higher increase of 1.7 per cent in the corresponding period of 1992. Government borrowings from the banking system decreased by Rs 128.0 million, from Rs 7,477.5 million at the end of December 1992 to Rs 7,349.5 million at the end of March 1993. Over the same period, private sector credit increased by Rs 279.1 million, from Rs 18,684.9 million to Rs 18,964.0 million, or by 1.5 per cent as compared with an increase of 4.7 per cent in the corresponding period of the preceding year.

Aggregate monetary resources increased by Rs 671.2 million, from Rs 34,702.0 million at the end of December 1992 to Rs 35,373.2 million at the end of March 1993, representing an increase of 1.9 per cent which was however lower than the increase of 4.1 per cent growth recorded in the corresponding period of the preceding year.

Money supply (M1) dropped by Rs 664.2 million or by 8.8 per cent from Rs 7,506.5 million at the end of December, 1992 to Rs 6,842.3 million at the end of March, 1993. This contraction in money supply was more marked than the 3.9 per cent fall recorded in the corresponding period of 1992.

Quasi-money (i.e. savings deposits plus time deposits with commercial banks) increased by Rs 1,335.4 million, from Rs 27,195.5 million at the end of December 1992 to Rs 28,530.9 million at the end of March 1993 representing an increase of 4.9 per cent as against a higher increase of 6.4 per cent in the corresponding period of the preceding year. Savings deposits increased by Rs 904.6 million, from Rs 12,914.9 million to Rs 13,819.5 million or by 7.0 per cent as against an increase of 5.8 per cent in the corresponding period of 1992. Private sector time deposits went up by Rs 430.8 million, from Rs 14,230.6 million to Rs 14,661.4 million, representing a lower growth rate of 3.0 per cent than that of 6.9 per cent in the corresponding quarter of the preceding year

The changes in monetary aggregates between end-December and end-March for the years 1991 through 1993 are shown in Table I.

Sectoral Distribution of Commercial Banks' Credit to the Private Sector

Total private sector credit increased by Rs 279.1 million, from Rs 18,684.9 million at the end of December, 1992 to Rs 18,964.0 million at the end of March, 1993, representing an expansion of 1.5 per cent, well below the 4.7 per cent increase registered in the corresponding period of the preceding year. This slackening in the pace of private sector credit expansion was largely due to the repayment of short-term advances by the Mauritius Sugar Syndicate and to a relatively weak demand for credit from the Export Processing Zone, Housing and Building Contractors.

Credit to the manufacturing sector (EPZ, DC, Ex-DC, Other Industries and Manufacturers and Pioneer Status) registered a mixed trend: 'Other Industries and Manufacturers' and 'DC Industries' recorded significant increases in credit of Rs 254.7 million from Rs 2,333.5 million to Rs 2,588.2 million and of Rs 87.3 million, from Rs 900.6 million to Rs 987.9 million, respectively. In contrast, credit to EPZ went up by only Rs 13.6 million, from Rs 3,746.2 million at the end of December, 1992 to Rs 3,759.8 million at the end of March, 1993 showing a marginal increase of 0.4 per cent as against a higher increase of 4.5 per cent in the corresponding period of the preceding year. Credit to 'Ex-DC Industries' dropped by Rs 47.3 million, from Rs 485.6 million to Rs 438.3 million as against a fall of Rs 2.9 million in the corresponding period of preceding year. Credit to the manufacturing sector as a whole went up by Rs 310.9 million, from Rs 7,486.8 million to Rs 7,797.7 million.

Credit to the sugar industry increased by Rs 193.4 million, from Rs 773.2 million at the end of December 1992 to Rs 966.6 million at the end of March 1993. However, over the same period, short-term advances to the Mauritius Sugar Syndicate fell by Rs 492.3 million from Rs 497.6 million to Rs 5.3 million.

Credit to 'Traders' increased by Rs 163.3 million, from Rs 2,196.5 million at the end of December 1992 to Rs 2,359.8 million at the end of March, 1993 or by 7.4 per cent as compared

to a higher increase of 13.6 per cent in the corresponding period of the preceding year. Credit to 'Housing' went up by Rs 30.3 million, from Rs 1,469.4 million to Rs 1,499.7 million, reflecting an increase of 2.1 per cent as against an increase of 7.0 per cent in the first quarter of 1992.

In sharp contrast to the expansion of 4.6 per cent registered between December 1991 and March 1992, credit to 'Hotels' dropped by 13.6 per cent or by Rs 74.4 million, from Rs 547.2 million at the end of December 1992 to Rs 472.8 million at the end of March 1993.

Table II shows the sector-wise distribution of private sector credit for the period June 1992 to March 1993.

Central Bank's Credit to Commercial Banks

The scale of central bank assistance to commercial banks during the period under review was more pronounced than in the corresponding period of 1992. The daily average level of central bank credit amounted to Rs 112.2 million as compared with Rs 89.1 million in the first quarter of 1992. Banks did not avail themselves of normal advances at Bank Rate, but relied on advances against the pledge of export bills (Other than for sugar), which accounted for 48.8 per cent of total credit extended. The daily average amount of such advances fluctuated between a peak of Rs 86.4 million in January and a trough of zero in February. In order to help some banks alleviate their temporary liquidity problems, the Bank of Mauritius provided them with special advances which reached a peak of Rs 260.0 million in March. Banks also availed themselves of a daily average amount of Rs 45.7 million under the Small Development Financing Scheme but did not utilize the scheme for Advance Payments to Non-Miller Sugar Cane Planters.

Interbank Money Market

The daily average amount of total interbank transactions during the period January-March 1993 was Rs 52.3 million, lower than that of Rs 85.3 million in the corresponding period of 1992. Transactions were confined to call money market and ranged between a trough of zero and a peak of Rs 245.0 million in January. The rates of interest on funds traded ranged between 7.05 per cent and 7.41 per cent, down from a range of 10.50 - 11.25 per cent in the first quarter of 1992. The weighted average rate for all interbank transactions thus fell from 10.75 per cent to 7.21 per cent.

Auctioning of Bills

During the period under review, 16 auctions of 91-Day, 182-Day and 364-Day Bills were held on a weekly/twice weekly basis. The annual weighted yield rate for the whole quarter was 6.10 per cent for 91-Day Bills, 6.69 per cent for 182-Day Bills and 7.29 per cent for 364-Day Bills. The overall weighted average yield rate for the three maturities was 7.07 per cent.

Table III gives a detailed breakdown of the weighted yield rates for the three types of bills for the period under review.

Prices

The Consumer Price Index (Base July 91-June 92 = 100) rose by 3.1 points from 107.6 in December 1992 to 110.7 in March 1993, as compared with an increase of 2.7 points in the first quarter of 1992. The rate of inflation for calendar year 1992 was 4.6 per cent and is estimated at 9.0 per cent for fiscal year 1992-93.

Foreign Exchange Reserves

The level of foreign exchange reserves went up from Rs 13,866.7 million at the end of December 1992 to Rs 14,685.3 million at the end of March 1993, representing an increase of Rs 818.6 million, as compared with a rise of Rs 1,081.7 million in the corresponding period of 1992. At the end of March 1993, the level of foreign exchange reserves of the Bank of Mauritius represented 29.5 weeks of imports, as compared with 30.2 weeks at the end of March 1992.
