

Central Bank Survey: End-June 2022

The monetary base expanded by 20.4 per cent, from Rs205,292 million at the end of May 2022 to Rs247,232 million at the end of June 2022. The expansion in the monetary base reflected increases in liabilities to Other Depository Corporations, which more than offset the drop in liabilities to other sectors and currency in circulation. Year-on-year, the monetary base expanded by 3.5 per cent in June 2022, as against a contraction of 15.4 per cent in May 2022.

On the sources side of the monetary base, the net foreign assets of the Bank increased by 14.2 per cent to Rs293,076 million, while domestic claims went up by 24.8 per cent to Rs64,696 million at end-June 2022.
