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Global economic and financial developments

Global economic recovery is under way. With COVID-19 still prevalent, prices of commodities have surged across the board as producers have not increased production capacity in time to match rising demand. Coupled with that, freight costs have remained elevated due to various logistics issues. The labour market has experienced some turbulences with many leaving the workforce due to the pandemic-induced disruptions. Those supply disturbances have in turn led to price indicators reaching figures above central banks' targets and have prompted some emerging market central banks to raise interest rates. However, other monetary authorities have remained prudent as any premature tightening could lead to adverse impacts on the nascent recovery.

In October 2021, the US dollar appreciated against both the euro and the pound sterling on a monthly average basis. The dollar traded in a tight range for pretty much the entire month. With no Federal Reserve meeting scheduled, the US dollar experienced low volatility. The greenback also consolidated its gains as markets continued to factor in tapering of asset purchases and US yields continued to rise. The euro traded at an average of US\$1.1600 in October 2021 compared to an average of US\$1.1774 a month earlier. The euro weakened in the first half of the month on the back of poor economic data within the Eurozone. It recovered afterwards as markets started to expect an announcement of tightening by the European Central Bank amid rising inflation. It reverted its gains as no definite moves to reduce asset purchases were announced. The Pound sterling traded at an average of US\$1.3682 in October 2021 compared to US\$1.3739 in September 2021. The Pound's movements followed market sentiment on whether the Bank of England would soon start to increase interest rates.

Global oil prices surged in October 2021, supported by expectations of higher oil demand and unchanged global production. The ICE Brent averaged US\$83.7 a barrel in October 2021, up by 11.8 per cent, from US\$74.9 a barrel in September 2021, while the NYMEX WTI increased by 13.5 per cent, from an average of US\$71.5 a barrel to US\$81.2 a barrel over the same period. Food prices also reached new peaks in October 2021. The FAO Food Price Index, which tracks monthly changes in the international prices of a basket of food commodities, rose for the third consecutive month to average 133.2 points in October 2021, up 3.0 per cent from the previous month and 31.3 per cent from October 2020.

Domestic economic and financial developments

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose by 0.5 index point, from 111.7 in September 2021 to 112.3 in October 2021. Year-on-year CPI inflation went up from 5.4 per cent in September 2021 to 5.8 per cent in October 2021. Headline inflation rose from 3.2 per cent to 3.4 per cent over the same period. The 12-month average CORE1 inflation stood at 3.5 per cent in October 2021, up from 3.3 per cent in September 2021, while CORE2 inflation also inched up from 4.2 per cent in September 2021 to 4.3 per cent in October 2021.

The y-o-y growth of Broad Money Liabilities (BML) lost some momentum, while claims on other sectors (excluding financial derivatives) grew at a higher pace in September 2021. Y-o-y, BML grew by 17.0 per cent in September 2021, lower compared to 19.1 per cent in August 2021, while the annual growth rate of claims on other sectors (excluding financial derivatives) increased from 18.8 per cent in August 2021 to 21.7 per cent in September 2021.

During October 2021, Government of Mauritius securities for a total amount of Rs7,700 million were issued in short, medium and long term tenors. The short-term yields remained near the lower bound of the interest rate corridor. The weighted average yield in the 91-Day tenor rose from 0.61 per cent in September 2021 to 0.63 per cent in October 2021 while the weighted average yields in the 182-Day and 364-Day tenors dropped from 0.88 per cent and 0.97 per cent to 0.86 per cent and 0.93 per cent, respectively, over the same period. A new benchmark Three-Year Treasury Notes maturing 5 October 2024 was issued in October 2021 for a nominal amount of Rs2,000 million with the weighted average yield increasing from 2.33 per cent in September 2021 to 2.38 per cent in October 2021. The coupon was set at 2.25 per cent. The 2.59 per cent Five-Year Government of Mauritius Bonds was re-opened in October 2021 for a nominal amount of Rs2,200 million to mature on 10 September 2026. The weighted average yield for the bond increased from 2.87 per cent in September 2021 to 3.09 per cent in October 2021.

In October 2021, the Bank also issued its own securities for a total amount of Rs27,400 million, mostly at the shorter end of the yield curve, to manage the rupee excess liquidity prevailing in the banking system. Maturing Bank of Mauritius securities over the period amounted to Rs12,980 million. Additionally, the Bank mopped a rupee equivalent of Rs9,296 million through FX operations.

Between September and October 2021, based on the weighted average dealt selling rate¹, the rupee depreciated against the US dollar and Pound Sterling but appreciated against the EURO. The average rupee exchange rates were Rs43.057/USD, Rs50.092/EUR and Rs59.036/GBP in October 2021 compared to Rs42.872/USD, Rs50.651/EUR and Rs59.034/GBP in September 2021.

The Gross Official International Reserves² (GOIR) of the country decreased by Rs5.8 billion, from Rs335.4 billion (equivalent to USD 7,842.1 million) as at end-September 2021 to Rs329.6 billion (equivalent to USD7,660.7 million) as at end-October 2021. Compared to end-October 2020, the GOIR rose by Rs49.7 billion. Based on the imports of goods (f.o.b.) and services for the calendar year 2020, the GOIR represented 19.3 months of imports as at end-October 2021 compared to 19.6 months as at end- September 2021 and 16.4 months as at end-October 2020.

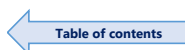
